Tarvin Parish now has its own website www.tarvinonline.org - which went live on 25th June. The successful launch took place at Tarvin Methodist Church with over 60 residents attending.

## WOODLAND FOOTPATH IMPROVEMENTS

Thanks to the huge amount of support we received from Tarvin people for the footpath project, funding has been obtained from WREN. Cheshire West and Chester Rural Support Fund and from your own donations. We are pleased and proud to tell you that our contractor, W.E. Parsons & Co Limited, is

due to begin to upgrade the path surface through the woodland on 22nd July 2013 and should be completed by 12th August.

They are due to start at the Townfield Lane end, but progress should be pretty rapid and so the woodland should be completely available for families to use for the majority of the school summer holidays.

For everyone's safety, the section of path being worked on must be closed but we will give notice of any path closures as far in advance as we can. And, of course, whenever one of the "Grogan's Walk" pathways is temporarily closed, the bridleway will always be open as an alternative route - watch out for the diversion signs.

We hope that your walk will not be spoiled and we ask you to bear with us while the work is under way. You know that the outcome will be well worthwhile!

## **ANOTHER ROAD CLOSURE**

The Parish Council has received notice that Cross Lanes will be closed for up to seven weeks from the Junction with Tarporley Road towards Oscroft from Monday 5th August to enable water main installation works to be carried out. At least with this road closure access to properties and for emergency vehicles will be maintained

Such disruption seems unfortunate given the recent closure of Tarporley Road - the residents of Oscroft must be beginning to feel somewhat put upon. The Parish Council has no control over such work but hopes that it can be completed as quickly and as well as the works on Tarporley Road.

Thinking of the Tarporley Road closure when the five week closure was announced the Parish Council was very concerned and took every step to ensure any problems were mitigated.

The closure has certainly inconvenience to individuals and businesses. but despite our initial fears it has not caused traffic chaos at the remaining entrances and exits from the village on the A54.

This is perhaps the best evidence we have which suggests that the Highways engineers professional advice, that the junctions in the village are not at capacity, is correct

#### **VILLAGE BUS STOPS/SHELTERS**

Funding for improvements to the village bus stops and shelters is available in the 2013 Cheshire West and Chester Councils budget, and the Parish Council feels that it is important to get a renovation programme that gives the best value for the village and that benefits the greatest number of people.

There was a lively and complex discussion at the recent Parish Council meeting after which it was agreed to recommend that:

- The bus stop on the north side of the High Street opposite the Post Office and close to Well Cottages (currently used by the 82 only) be removed
- The bus stop on the south side of the High Street (near the chemist) remain but the road markings be extended along the High Street to allow the bus to pull in parallel to the kerb and thus allow cars to pass more easily while it picks up and drops passengers.
- o Bus shelters be provided for both sides of the road for the stops at the end of Hockenhull Lane, with the one on the south side being moved a little further west away from the junction.
- The existing bus shelter on Church Street be upgraded and a new one installed opposite in a style appropriate for a Conservation Area. The new one should be sited as far away from Duckers Well as is practical to reduce the possibility of casual damage to this culturally sensitive site.

The recommendations will now be presented to Cheshire West and Chester Council for comment and if appropriate further examination before a final decision is reached.

# ETAPE MERCIA CLOSED ROAD CYCLE EVENT – 18TH AUGUST 2013

A reminder that a closed road cycle race mentioned in the last edition is coming through our Parish on the morning of Sunday 18th August.

The road from Willington Corner through Oscroft to Tarvin Sands will be closed with no vehicular exit from 7.30am until 10.20am. There will be temporary traffic lights at the junction of Shay Lane and the A54 where the course crosses the main road and continues towards Barrow.

## MIND THE GAP

As residents of the Ridgeway will know, an informal gap has been made in the hedge between the Ridgeway and the A54 road to allow access to the village via the main road and now to the Co-op store. During the store's construction the gap was widened with the removal of a tree to allow some utilities to be laid, which, when re-instated, has become very weak and spindly.

The suggestion has been made to the Parish Council that this gap be made a formal opening with the provision of steps/ kissing gate/railings, for both the convenience and safety of users.

This suggestion was put to the Highways department during a recent 'walkabout' with Council officers, but turned down for a number of reasons.

The Parish Council determined to find out how great the demand for such an improvement was and conducted a simple survey of residents during June. Thank you to those of you who took the time to complete and return the form. The vast majority were in favour of improving

the gap. It was agreed that this information be passed on the Cheshire West and Chester Council by the Clerk.

The Parish Council will now concentrate on resolving the many difficulties relating to the ownership of the hedge as Cheshire West and Chester Council has said that it will not consider moving this project forward until ownership is resolved.

# ANNUAL INSPECTION OF PLAY EQUIPMENT 2013

In addition to the regular checks carried out on the Play Equipment on the King George V Playing Field by those appointed by the Parish Council the Council also has an annual inspection and risk assessment carried out by an external independent body. The latest written report has just been received from Morral Play Services Ltd and the good news is that overall the report is extremely good and that only a small amount of maintenance work is required.

### **PARKING OUR CARS**

A reminder to car drivers - please show consideration to others when parking within the parish.

Some car owners are obstructing the pavement by parking either completely or partly on it causing pedestrians to walk in the road to pass. Others are parking on bends or double yellow lines. "I will only be a couple of minutes" or "everyone else is doing it" or "No one is going to report me" are not acceptable reasons for parking inconsiderately or illegally.

Parking your car correctly on the road can help to reduce traffic speed and keeps our streets safer.

A reminder that the "101" Police nonemergency number should be used to report crime and other concerns that do not require an emergency response

Cheshire Crimestoppers was established in 1998 and promotes the Crimestoppers message within the County of Cheshire and the Unitary Authorities of Halton and Warrington. Increasingly, witnesses to crime, and those who know who may have committed a crime, are reluctant to go directly to the Police, or to give evidence in court. Crimestoppers allows you to avoid both by anonymously contacting a dedicated national call number, with information about crime, at any time, 365 days of the year. Callers are not asked for their name, or for any other means of identification. A caller's number can not be traced and does not appear on itemised telephone statements. The information is passed to the Police but the Police will never know who has called Crimestoppers.
