ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

Many residents, along with the Parish Council, have expressed concern regarding the poor behaviour of a number of people who use the King George V Playing Field and a number of incidents have been reported to the Police. The complaints have been varied, as have the times, with late afternoon and early evening appearing to be the worst times and verbal abuse appearing to be the most common complaint. The areas of the field where the incidents have been reported are also varied but mainly at the top of the field on the grassed area rather than the car park, by the children's play area, and behind the Scout and Guide Hut close to the entrance to the Bowling Club.

The Parish Council are looking at possible solutions including having CCTV covering the field. In the meantime if you witness any unacceptable behaviour please report it to the Police using the 101 number.

Most of those causing the problems will probably live in the Parish and be living with parents or other adults. If you are one of those adults, and if the person you are responsible for or are living with frequents the playing field in an evening do you really know what they are taking part in? They may be among the majority who respect the field and behave according but ...

GYPSY AND TRAVELLER SITE CONSULTATION UPDATE

The Cheshire West and Chester Council Local Plan Working Group has accepted a report stating that the site at No 10 Small Holdings, Tarporley Road is recognised as 'unavailable' for allocation as a Traveller site.

They have not fully resolved their challenge of identifying suitable sites so it has been recommended that they review the position as part of a separate Traveller Development Plan Document. If this approach is approved by the Borough Council Cabinet, this work would not start until 2019 at the earliest.

Although the designation of the site is a very positive outcome, it is important that the Parish protects itself against such issues arising in the future. One of the main ways of achieving this is through the establishment of a well worded Neighbourhood

Development Plan for the Parish. The Steering Group and the Parish Council have been working on a Neighbourhood Plan for the last two years. There is still work to be done but we thank all those who have contributed to the above work to date, particularly the Steering Group and Residents Group.

TARVIN EDUCATION TRUST

This is a Charity established up to manage the endowment of the old Tarvin Grammar School. Its purpose is to assist the educational needs of students of secondary school age and older who live in the Ancient Parish of Tarvin. This assistance may take the form of financial assistance for tuition fees, books, musical instruments, and travel on approved courses.

Concerns have been raised about the speed of traffic using Tarporley Road and Highways are being asked to design a traffic management scheme to reduce the speed of traffic using the road.

OVERGROWN HEDGES

The Parish Council regularly receive complaints about overhanging hedges and trees. This makes life particularly difficult for pedestrians.

Please check the hedges and trees on your property and check that they have not encroached onto the footway. If they have please have them cut back. Thank you

PARK LANE

At the annual meeting of Tarvin Parish residents held on 4th May a member of the public queried the safety of Park Lane and suggested that the Parish Council consider asking the Highways Authority to either close the lane to vehicular traffic or make it one way.

The Parish Council requested feedback from residents via Tarvinonline and the Parish noticeboards and over 40 responses were received. At the June Council Meeting Councillors considered the responses and after discussion agreed that access to the Lane should remain unchanged but that the owner of the hedge which run alongside the Close should be encouraged to maintain it so as to prevent encroachment onto the roadway.

Thank you to all who responded, it was appreciated.

GUTTERS AND SWEEPING

Some areas in the Parish were mechanically swept by Cheshire West and Chester Council contractors early in July, but it appears that the weeds had not been treated before the sweep. The Parish Council has asked Streetscene when it intends to treat the weeds in the gutters and their schedule for sweeping.
