GRANT AID

The Parish Council allocates a small amount of its precept each year to provide grants to voluntary organisations based in the Parish who are in need of financial support. When considering grant aid to local groups the Parish Council normally takes into the following into account:

The Group's current & forecast financial position

• Whether all other potential legitimate sources of funding have been tried and the outcome of those approaches, including reasons for any rejection.

The overall benefit derived by the community from the work of the Group and/or the asset over which they have stewardship - where eligibility to partake is very narrowly defined or restrictive grants will not be given
Whether access to the asset, facility or activity is available to all and if restricted the reason for and nature of any restriction. Grants provided will normally not be restricted in any way but given on the condition that the Parish Council receive a written report from the recipient indicating how the money has been spent along with a copy of their annual accounts showing the grant as a separate item.

Organisations wishing to be considered for grant aid during the coming year should apply in writing to the Clerk of the Council no later than Friday 7th March 2014.

TARVIN EDUCATION TRUST

This is a Charity established up to manage the endowment of the old Tarvin Grammar School.

Its purpose is to assist the educational needs Tarvin Times is Published by Tarvin Parish Council of students of secondary school age and older who live in the Ancient Parish of Tarvin. This assistance may take the form of financial assistance for tuition fees, books, musical instruments, and travel on approved courses. PARISH COUNCIL REVENUE BUDGET 2014/15

The Parish Council has agreed a budget for the financial year which begins April 2014. The overall increase in the precept will be 9%. For a Band D property this will mean a precept of \pounds 31.89 or 60 pence per week.

The main reasons for the increase are:

* work on the King George V Playing Field including the 3 year tree inspection, a tree removal near the bowling green, planting 4 new trees and football pitch goalmouth improvements.

*an increased grant provision for local groups

(see item on Grant Aid)

* meeting a contractual obligation to the Clerk that should have been addressed many years ago

* storage of P Council documents * inflation

The Parish Council whilst regretting the above inflation increase believes that it is important to set a realistic budget that accurately and fairly reflects its commitments and responsibilities.

STREETSCENE

Keeping our streets clear of litter is the job of Cheshire West and Chester Council's Streetscene section. For sometime the Parish Council has been concerned about the standard of street cleansing achieved and these concerns have been taken up with Streetscene. Further consideration of the way forward will be examined at the February Parish Council meeting

FRACKING

Although there are, as far we know, NO PLANS to frack in the Parish Council area the Council is keeping a watching brief on this matter.

THE PARISH COUNCIL AREA

From April 2015 the area covered by Tarvin Parish Council will expand.

Adjacent unparished areas of Bruen Stapleford, Hockenhull and Prior's Heys are expected to come into the parish area whilst a few properties east of Common Lane, Willington Corner are likely to transfer out of the Parish.

The new, expanded Parish will continue with 11 elected Councillors but current ward arrangements will cease and not be replaced.
